s 2023 comes to a close, NDTC marked its 30th Anniversary on November 1, celebrating with a luncheon for employees, retirees, and the Board of Directors. I would like to express my deepest gratitude to each and every one of these individuals who has contributed to making NDTC what it is today, and I look forward to our future.

As the years go by, the things we worry about continue to change. A very noticeable issue lately is cybersecurity. NDTC has been developing cybersecurity policies and training our staff for the past few years. Cybersecurity is something we all need to be concerned about whenever we navigate the internet.

Some cybersecurity tips we should be aware of are:

When we have a broadband connection, we should have a firewall/router, which helps protect computers against outside cyber attackers. It is important to keep firewalls updated so they can do the best job of protecting our networks.

We also need to look at ourselves and how we handle the amount of bogus emails we receive today. We need to be careful about clicking on links embedded within emails unless we trust it is a legitimate email. Clicking on these links may cause malicious software to be downloaded to our devices, or tempt us to give up personal information. NDTC performs monthly training focused on this subject.

The use of strong passwords and multi-factor authentication is essential to protect our online accounts from unauthorized users. Strong passwords, the longer the better, should be a mixture of upper and lower case letters, numbers, and symbols with no ties to personal information. Multi-factor authentication is a second code



needed to access online accounts that may be sent to a phone, as a text message or an email account.

Make sure that we keep all software updated on all of our devices.

Hopefully, by following these tips we can improve our online safety.


The end of 2023 brings negotiations of new retransmission agreements which give NDTC the right to broadcast NBC, ABC, CBS, and FOX networks. Some of these broadcasting providers are asking for up to 30% increases per year! This makes it hard for video providers like NDTC to keep rates low. It may not be too long before we are seeing rates of over \$10 per month for some of these channels. Typically, our only option is to pass the rate increases on to our subscribers. estled in the heart of North Dakota, Cando captures the essence of small-town America. With its friendly community, rich history, and scenic surroundings, Cando offers a unique charm that attracts visitors and makes it a wonderful place to call home. According to Mayor Rollie Bjornstad, "Residents are downto-earth and it's a friendly town where everyone knows everyone, and they all get along."



Established in 1884, the town's name came about because of a disagreement between two commissioners at the time. In the words of Mr. Parker (Commissioner at the time),

Lifeline & Link Up Assistance

Lifeline

Lifeline Assistance is a non-transferable government program that provides a discount of up to \$9.25 a month toward one telephone service or eligible broadband service for qualified low-income consumers, and up to \$34.25 in Lifeline support for eligible consumers on Tribal lands. Federal rules prohibit eligible consumers from receiving more than one Lifeline service per household.

Link Up

Link Up reduces the cost of initiating new telephone service to eligible residents of Tribal lands at the subscriber's principal place of residence.

An individual may be eligible for the program-supported service if he or she has a household income at or below 135 percent of the federal poverty guidelines, or if they receive benefits from one of the following qualifying programs:

- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Medicaid
- Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit Program

Consumers residing on Tribal lands may be eligible for program-supported service if their household income is at or below 135 percent of the federal poverty guidelines, if they participate in one of the federal programs listed above or in one of the following programs:

- Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
- Tribally-administered Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Head Start (only those households meeting income qualifying standards)
- Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations



Consumers can apply through the National Verifier at checklifeline.org or submit a paper application with documentation to the Lifeline Support Center. NDTC is no longer able to accept documentation to determine eligibility.

Program

he Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a federal program designed to assist low-income households in paying for broadband internet service. ACP is under the authority of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and is administered by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC). ACP replaced the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program (EBBP).

Eligible households can receive up to a \$30/month discount on internet service and up to a \$75/month discount if a household is on qualifying Tribal lands.

The ACP benefit is non-transferable and limited to one monthly internet discount per household. ACP is available for all NDTC service offerings (includes broadband internet access service or a bundle of broadband internet service along with voice telephone service).

You may obtain ACP-supported broadband internet service from any participating provider of your choosing, and may change providers at any time. In the event the program ends or when a household is no longer eligible, customers will be subject to NDTC's regular rates, terms, and conditions.

You can get ACP if you (or someone in your household): (a) already receives a Lifeline Benefit; (b) participates in certain Federal Assistance Programs (National School Lunch Program, WIC, Federal Pell Grant Program, SNAP, Medicaid, SSI, FPHA, Veterans pension and Survivors Benefit); or (c) if your household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Apply for ACP with USAC at getinternet.gov. After USAC determines you are eligible, call NDTC to enroll in the ACP program.

- Have parents or guardians whose primary residence is within NDTC exchanges and are current subscribers to NDTC's telecommunication services


